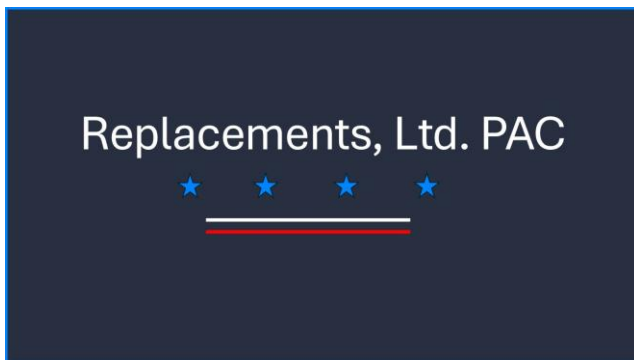

When making a decision about an endorsement, we consider whether a candidate's past and current positions support the business and social interests of Replacements, Ltd. (which includes but is not limited to Stronger Communities, LGBTQ+ Legal Equality, Immigration Law Reform, Anti-Poverty Efforts, Health, Education, Sensible Gun Laws, Environmental Stewardship, Good Government, and Campaign Finance Reform), whether a candidate's qualities and activities are in line with our core values, and whether the candidate is strategically viable. After compiling and evaluating all information, we publish a Voter Guide for those interested.
